

Dear Camelot by the Lake Homeowners,

I want to take a moment to inform you about the effects of the recent frost on our landscape plants and St. Augustine grass in our community.

The freezing temperatures have caused visible damage to many warm-season plants and lawns, particularly St. Augustine turf, which is highly sensitive to cold weather. You may notice browning, thinning, or blackened foliage on turf and ornamental plants. While this can look concerning, in most cases the damage is cosmetic and does not mean the plants or lawn are permanently lost.

At this time, our Landscapers have recommend allowing affected plants and turf to recover naturally as temperatures warm. Pruning or cutting back frost-damaged material too early can sometimes cause additional stress. As part of our regular Landscape maintenance, we will continue to monitor conditions and address any necessary cleanup, pruning, or recovery treatments at the appropriate time. As spring approaches, new growth should emerge and many affected areas are expected to recover.
